## Music: A Lifetime Adventure By David Lang 1983 Euphonium Iowa

In May of 2021, I waved my baton for the last time as director of bands at Independence High School (Iowa). I knew I wanted to be a teacher since I joined the band in eighth grade. I had strong mentors and directors through my high school and college years, who encouraged me to a path of music education. As I grew through my teaching career, I saw that I was able to impart that same encouragement and mentorship to many of my students. This has been one of the many joys of my life.

My wife, Lisa is also a retired band director. We taught together in the same school district for most of our careers. She was the elementary di-

rector and I was the high school director. We devoted over three decades helping students to be the best musicians and humans they could be. We built a strong family atmosphere in our band and many students needed that more than they needed the music. We implemented a leadership program for our students to develop the skills necessary to be good role models, have a servant mindset and be able to build relationships with their peers. We felt these skills helped us have a successful band and also carry into other activities and life.

Thinking back on my experience of being part of the McDonald's All-American Band, I realized it cemented my desire to be a music educator. Coming together with stu-

dents from all over the United States, rehearsing, expecting excellence and a high level of performance, instilled a pattern of work ethic in my music that I still have today. Now that I am retired, I have re-

#### Yamaha Awards Instrument to Member of McDonald's All-American High School Band

David Allen Lang, a senior at Dubuque High School, Dubuque, IA, has been awarded a new musical instrument from Yamaha Musical Products.

David, the son of Eugene Lang, plays the euphonium in the Dubuque High School Band under the direction of Floyd G. Rundle.

The All-American Band, sponsored by McDonald's restaurants to recognize the achievements of outstanding high school musicians, is composed of two students from each state and the District of Columbia, plus one member each from the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico. David performed with the 104-member musical unit in the nationally televised Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City; the Fiesta Bowl Parade on December 31 in Phoenix, AZ; and the Tournament of Roses Parade January 2 in Pasadena, CA.

turned to the same habits that I developed back then with practicing, performing, and learning new music. The week after my retirement, I joined an area British style brass band that rehearses once a week year round. While I absolutely loved teaching, I am now again realizing why I love music so much. Making music gives me joy and happiness. I can spend hours on end just playing my euphonium





and writing and arranging music. I have also learned a new skill with audio and visual production that I use to share my music.

In 1988, the year after graduating from the University of Iowa, my wife and I were asked to be on the staff of the Iowa's Ambassadors of Music European tour. We did this trip biennially for 20 years. My favorite country to visit was Switzerland. It is a beautiful country, with wonderful scenery, kind and generous people, and the alphorn! On our trips through Switzerland, I heard the local Swiss folklore groups and was very much enthralled with the beautiful sound of the alphorn. I eventually purchased my own Swiss-made alphorn, but had little time to practice it during my teaching career. Now that I am retired, I have devoted much time to further hone my skills on this beautiful and unique instrument.

In 2019, I was given the opportunity to participate in the first AAB reunion in St. Louis. We had an awesome time making music together. I heard from several people who said they hadn't touched their instrument since high school and some that haven't stopped playing. I highly recommend this experience to ALL alumni to help reinvigorate your love of making music.
